

General information on data protection

ClenSol SA wants users of its site to be informed of how their personal data is used and processed. We comply with Swiss data protection legislation and treat our customers' information confidentially.

When you visit our website www.clenSol.ch, some information is used by traffic analysis software to improve the quality of the experience, information and visit. The latter are not linked to personal data and therefore there is no direct identification of the user. As a user of our website, we inform you below about the data that is stored and how it is used.

Cookies

This website uses cookies for pseudonymised audience measurement, which are transmitted to the user's browser either by our server or by the server of third parties. Cookies are small files that are stored on your device, and your browser accesses these files. The use of cookies increases the usability and security of this website.

You can prevent cookies from being saved on your device by making the appropriate settings in your browser. However, it is not guaranteed that you will be able to access all the functions of this site without restrictions, if your browser does not allow cookies. The processing of a contact form or our shop involves communication between your terminal and our servers, and involves the essential identification of both parties, on a technical level. None of this data is forwarded to third parties under any circumstances.

Google Analytics

For the purpose of optimising and analysing our online offer, this website uses the "Google Analytics" service provided by Google Inc. (1600 Amphitheatre Parkway, Mountain View, CA 94043, USA). The Google Analytics service uses "cookies" - text files that are stored on your device, in part to determine the actual number of unique visitors to a site, and to prevent statistics from being distorted if a person or automatic system repeatedly clicks on the button to refresh the page, among other things. The data collected by cookies is generally transmitted to a Google server in the United States, where it is stored, allowing Google to compile an assessment of website traffic and activity, and to provide services related to Internet usage.

The data collected by Google is used to evaluate the use of our online offer by individual users, for example to report on website activity, in order to improve our online offer.

A browser plug-in allows you to prevent data collected by cookies (including your IP address) from being sent to Google Inc. and used by Google Inc. Click on the following link to access the corresponding add-on module:
